At present the stores are distributed in about seventeen different small cupboards which are inconvenient, inadequate, and renders it necessary to keep a large proportion of these stores in the new zymotic ward, where the largest storage is fitted. This cannot be used when we have infectious cases.

The cost of the proposed, including arrangements and shelves estimated at £440.
